Trial Games

It is that time of year, almost, and the season is just around the corner. I would like to remind you that we are first and foremost a sporting club. It is the job of the selectors to choose the sides that we think will give the club the best chance of high performance.

The two factors that each player brings to the table are first, their ability to perform, and second, their impact on the players around them.

If you want to play in a higher division, you must not only be able to bowl well, but you must be able to play the role that you are assigned with a positive attitude at all times. That said, we had some good things, and bad things, come out of our last season and we will be looking to improve.

Personally, I think our goals should be:

- Return to the Grand Final in Division 3.
- Win Division 5 and gain promotion to Division 4
- Win Division 6 and gain promotion to Division 5.
- Make it into the finals in all other divisions.

Many of our members have been working hard in the off season, with a few even being selected for state sides, or state development squads. We have had many players avail themselves of the coaching and many members also play multiple times a week in various state and club competitions.

All trials will be conducted in club uniform.

The first two assessments will be held on the 6 and 13 of September.

The morning sessions on the 6 September is the Club Clean at 9 am followed by a BBQ Lunch

The trials begin after lunch and will follow the format of the next week trial.

On the 13 September a 9.30am start, will be to score leads and seconds.

These sessions should take approximately 2.5 hours and will be scored individually. Each player will play a total of 84 bowls at minimum, medium and maximum lengths for a score. Exact details will be shown on the day.

The afternoon sessions will be a 12 for 12.30 pm start and will be to assess thirds and skippers. We will set up scenarios with neutral bowls in blocking positions and play against the blocking bowls and each other. We will have two 21 end games and will judge shot selection and shot execution. Scores will be kept. Based on who is playing, the selection panel will pair 3rds and skips for each round. Since there will be no jack rolls and the scenarios will be pre-determined, this should only take about 3 hours.

You can play in both sessions if you want to. The weather should be cool and with no jack rolling, the trials should move along quickly.

The third trial on 20 Sept will be against Sturt, as will the last trial on 4 Oct. Since neither club has the room to play everyone at home on one day, we will split on both days so that they have the opportunity to play on synthetic and we have the opportunity to play on grass. These trials will be held at normal pennant times.

The fourth trial on 27 Sept will be a shortened morning session, with a 9 for 9.30 start. It is AFL Grand Final Day. Depending on what we are needing to accomplish and who is available, we will let you know what we are doing on the day.

No one will be required to attend any of the trial sessions. You will still be selected but you will be selected based on reputation against players that have put in a lot of time and effort to get better. Complete these assessments and trials like you are playing in a Grand Final. Being able to bowl well and playing the game correctly are two very different things. That is part of accepting and playing the role you get selected for. Discipline and consistency go a long way to us achieving our goals.
